

The International Aviation Academy Norwich (IAAN Norwich) is a world-class training centre located next to Norwich Airport, training the next generation of aviation professionals. It provides a purpose-built learning environment that allows you to work on a live Boeing 737 aircraft in the specialist Aviation Emulation Zone. Our aviation engineering courses have been developed with employers and provide excellent progression routes to highly skilled and well-paid employment in the aviation sector both nationally and internationally. Courses are delivered in partnership with KLM UK Engineering, who have over 40 years' experience in aircraft technical training and aircraft maintenance and provide direct pathways into aviation engineering and jobs within the industry.





Norwich is at the centre of a travel network which connects it to all of the towns and villages in the region and onwards to London, the Midlands, the Northern counties and beyond.

London is less than two hours away by a direct train service, which leaves Norwich every thirty minutes. You can also get there by a non-stop coach service, run by National Express from the bus station in the city centre. Heading north, you can be in Leeds in less than three and a half hours by joining the East Coast main line, or Newcastle in under four; less than you might think, which is great for travelling here as well as getting out and about while you study.

Norwich is in the heart of Norfolk, one of the most beautiful counties in the UK.

Living here, you will be close to the Broads, the network of quiet waterways that welcomes sailors, cyclists, paddlers and walkers all year round. Sipping a drink at a riverside pub can be a perfect break from your studies and hiring a boat for a day out with friends is a great way to celebrate your results in the summer. In Norfolk we have so much coastline we almost take it for granted. The bigger towns attract the tourists in the summer, but there is always space on one of our vast beaches to take a stroll or pitch up for a picnic.

The city centre features a great mix of independent pubs, clubs, and cocktail bars alongside well-known national favourites. You can try your hand at retro bowling, electro darts, or belt out a few karaoke classics. Film enthusiasts can enjoy live-streamed performances, new releases, and timeless favourites at the much-loved Cinema City.

Music plays a huge role in Norwich's nightlife. From the regular performances by Norwich Philharmonic to major international acts at the Norfolk & Norwich Festival each May, there's always something happening.

The LCR, The Waterfront, and Earlham Park regularly host artists across all genres, while events like Wild Paths and venues like Last Pub Standing showcase brilliant local talent.

Theatre lovers are equally well served, with plays, musicals, comedy, and dance at the Theatre Royal, and intimate performances at Norwich Playhouse - not forgetting its lively bar. For something unique, there's the Norwich Puppet Theatre and the Maddermarket Theatre, home to the community-driven Norwich Players.


# **Sport and fitness**

# **Travelling by train**

Norwich Train Station is approximately 1.5 miles from our Ipswich Road campus. Bus services operate frequently between the train station and the city centre, which is about an 8-10 minute walk away from St Stephens Street/Red Lion Street.

# **Norfolk House**

Norfolk House can be found in the heart of the city centre on Exchange Street. There is no car parking available, but lots of car parks are located nearby. The nearest bus stops are on Castle Meadow, Tombland, and Prince of Wales Road.

# **Easton College**

Easton College is located 6.5 miles from Norwich city centre, off the A47. Car parking is available on campus and the nearby village of Easton is well-served by direct bus routes from the city centre.

# **Ipswich Road**

The Ipswich Road campus is located on Ipswich Road, approximately 1/2 mile from the city centre. Car parking is available on campus and bus stops are located outside the college.

# **Accommodation for**

We offer accommodation for our Degree and Higher Education students at our Easton College campus to the west of Norwich.

Our accommodation has single study bedrooms. Although meals may be purchased from college catering outlets during term times, rooms are let on a self-catering basis for the academic year (35 weeks).

# What's included in the accommodation?

All rooms contain a bed and mattress, a desk, chair, wardrobe, a hot and cold tapped sink, plenty of storage space, a set of curtains, a waste paper basket, a single vanity mirror and light and a good-sized pinboard for organisation. All rooms are centrally heated at no extra cost.

Other facilities and services include:

- Free parking
- A team of Residential Assistants to support your needs
- Clothes washing and drying facilities
- Free Wi-Fi

- Minibus trips and activities throughout the week

Please note, bedding, pillows and towels are not provided.

All our rooms for HE students are en-suite and located in Bradley Hall, where you will also find a large open plan sitting and kitchen area.



# **Home comforts**

We want you to feel at home and relaxed in your own space. You can create your own spaces within your rooms by using posters, photos, books, games consoles and computers. These are all perfect accessories to bring along to help you settle and feel at home.

Please do not bring microwaves, candles, incense sticks or anything flammable. Please refrain from bringing loudspeakers. You are able to bring your own fridges and televisions (a TV licence is required).

# Facilities and activities

Easton College boasts some excellent facilities to keep you active and entertained. This includes our Tennis Centre, gym and fitness centre and 3G pitch.

In residence, we offer free daily activities and trips away to fun places. Activities in our calendar include paintballing, go-karting, swimming, football, tennis, basketball, cooking, film nights, city trips and regular trips to the local supermarket.

# Accommodation costs and payment plans

HE Accommodation is rented for a set price of £155\* per week for the duration of the standard HE academic year. This includes Wi-Fi, electricity, water and all other amenities. \*costs are subject to inflationary increase for 2026/27.

Your contract will start in September 2026 and end in June 2027 (subject to course requirements).

Please note the contract relates to academic weeks and your room will need to be emptied during the Christmas period.

Our en-suite rooms are single occupancy study rooms with a bathroom/wet room included. These cost £142.20 per week (inclusive of bills) on a self-catering basis. There is also a refundable £200 damage deposit paid upon application.



# **UEA Accommodation**

Our long-established partnership with UEA will allow you to benefit from their Student Accommodation Service. Please note that this service is only available to international students on a points-based student visa.

Once we have received your deposit, you will be able to access Home Run, managed by the Union of UEA students. Home Run is dedicated to helping you find suitable accommodation in Norwich and provides an online property search service as well as a message board to find housemates. Established for 15 years, all properties advertised on their website meet their minimum standards policy.

Home Run is a free service and has the largest listing of student housing in the region. It is recommended by the University of East Anglia.

Please note that to access the property search service and message board you will need to have a student account, details of which can be provided once City College Norwich has received a deposit.

# **Library services**

Our Higher Education library facilities are available across all our campuses, providing access to an array of resources to support your studies.

### **Browse the shelves**

You can borrow any resources by speaking to the library staff at the front desk of each of our campus libraries.

### Reservations

You can use the library's reservations service to request items from any college library, to be collected from your chosen library at a time you choose.

### **eBooks**

eBooks are a great alternative to borrowing hard copies from the library or purchasing your own books. They are free to use/download at a library computer, or your own device at home.

## Online Journal Databases

You will have access to journal databases, allowing you to search thousands of online journals at the same time. Taylor and Francis, SAGE and ScienceDirect are the largest databases we offer access to.

# Referencing

Our library staff are happy to check through your references and in-text citations used in assignments. They are able to check the first three instances of each referencing format, for example books, journal articles and websites, and will leave comments for you to action.

We also offer video guidance on referencing, a referencing checklist and a leaflet with examples of how to format your full references and in-text citations using Harvard referencing.


### Proofreading

Your experience shapes these meetings, and your course rep will feed this back to the meeting. From this feedback there will be specific actions to improve your experience, which are recorded and tracked through our 'You Said, We Did' action log.

For example, our students requested improved accessibility for one of our buildings, so we introduced a colour-coded system to each floor to make it easier to navigate.

Training for student reps is provided by our Higher Education Leadership team supported by our Students' Union.

City College Norwich is a UKVI-approved pointsbased student visa sponsor, which allows the college to sponsor international students to enter, live and study in the UK for the duration of your course.

Please note that bachelor's degrees, Fdsc Aircraft courses, and Access to Higher Education Diplomas are the only courses at City College Norwich available to students on a points-based student Visa.

If you are currently living, or are able to live, in the UK on another type of immigration permission (for example such as a Leave to Remain/Enter, Indefinite Leave/Settlement, European Settled or Pre-Settled Status or one of the Ukrainian Schemes) you may have a different range of course options available to you. # **English language requirements for**

# a student visa

If you are applying as a points-based student visa, in addition to meeting the specific English language entry requirements for your course, you will also be required to demonstrate your English language knowledge at a CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) B2 Level. This is met by undertaking a Secured English Language Test (IELTS for UKVI - Academic) at the following standard: overall score of 6.0 with a minimum score of 5.5 in reading, writing, speaking and listening.

Although undertaking a SELT is the preferred method, the college also has several other means of assessing English language ability which may be acceptable for the B2 requirements of a student visa. I graduated with a BSc (Hons) in Professional Aviation Engineering Practice in 2022, and shortly afterwards I secured an avionics apprenticeship with Eagle Copters in Calgary, Canada. I'm absolutely loving the role – no two days are ever

the same!

I've had the opportunity to work on a wide range of aircraft, including helicopters used by the Calgary Police, air ambulances, and those involved in aerial firefighting – which is especially important here due to the frequent forest fires. One of the highlights so far has been working on a helicopter that appeared in the final series of Stranger Things! At the moment, we're working on a Bell 205 helicopter with a 1963 serial number that actually flew in the Vietnam War. The variety of projects I get to be involved in is incredible.

My time on the course really gave me the knowledge and practical skills I needed to step straight into the industry.

Employers are really keen on candidates who've had hands-on experience, and the Boeing 737 at the International Aviation Academy – or 'Elsie' as we all called her – was perfect for that. We had loads of opportunities to apply what we were learning in a real-world setting.

Another major benefit was learning from lecturers who had worked in the aviation industry for years - both from KLM and City College Norwich. Their insights and experience were invaluable and played a big part in helping me land my first position after graduation.

Looking ahead, I'm aiming to get my avionics licence and eventually move into aircraft design and certification engineering.



I began my journey with City College Norwich at Easton College by studying a Level 3 in Countryside Management, while also volunteering regularly with local ecological organisations. I was inspired to stay on at CCN HE and went on to complete a BSc (Hons) in Wildlife and Conservation in 2023.

CCN HE is a fantastic alternative to a traditional university, particularly if you want to work or volunteer alongside your studies. Having access to the farm and the nature reserve for practical sessions was such a valuable part of my experience.

I've loved all the practical fieldwork modules and species identification we get to do. It's been a lot of fun applying what I've learnt in the classroom to real-world environments. As someone from a non-environmental background, the course has given me direction and allowed me to find what I'm

passionate about, sparking a lifelong interest in nature and wildlife.

Since graduating, I've continued volunteering, including butterfly surveys at Broadland Country Park and meadow work with the Trust for Conservation Volunteers. Leading volunteer groups has also helped me grow my leadership skills.

Volunteering alongside my studies gave me practical experience and the confidence to apply what I was learning in real-life settings.

I'm excited to be joining a three-month residential volunteering project with the RSPB on a remote island off Northern Ireland. After that, I hope to work as a ranger or warden, while continuing my volunteering journey.

# **Short Term Study Visa**

Our part time ESOL course is an eligible programme for the issuance of the Study English in the UK (Short-term Study Visa.) This visa can be issued for up to 11 months for an English language course studied at an approved student visa sponsor in the UK. See www.gov.uk/study-visit-visa for more details.

We have a number of different levels of study:

- **Entry Level 1**
- **Entry Level 2**
- **Entry Level 3**
- Level 1
- Level 2

Throughout, you will be tested on your speaking, listening, reading, writing and grammar skills (spelling, punctuation etc). You need to pass each of these topics in each level before you can move up to the next level. Once you have passed ESOL Level 1, you can either go onto ESOL Level 2 or apply for our Functional Skills or GCSE courses in Maths and English if you need to.

The ESOL qualification is widely recognised by employers and will assist with your progression into further education, employment as well as everyday life in the UK.

You will be assessed through exams, and you may be able to take your exam early and progress to a second level within one year. Following the successful completion of the course, with a good attendance and behaviour record, you may be able to progress on to further courses at the

# How to apply

It is strongly recommended that you do not make any final preparations to travel to the UK until after you have been granted a visa by the UKVI to study in the UK. This includes booking flights or accommodation, or resigning from any employment or study you may be undertaking in your home or another country.

# **English Language**Short Term Study Visa

### **Part Time ESOL Applications**

- 1. Contact the International Team for course information, and a preliminary assessment. You may be asked to supply documentation such as a copy of your passport and prior qualifications at this stage. If your preliminary assessment is successful, you will be asked to make a formal application by the International Team.
- 2. An interview with an ESOL teacher will be arranged via Teams or Zoom (if you are overseas), or on campus.
- 3. Your outcome will be informed to you by the International Team via email, including notification of your English learning level.
- 4. The International Team will request any final required documentation (usually relating to your financial and immigration obligations.)
- 5. The college will decide at this stage whether to support you for a Short-Term student visa. If the college does agree, a formal written offer of admission will be sent to you by the International Team.
- 6. Accept the written offer, along with payment of the required fees and all documents requested by the International Team.

- 7. A formal letter of support for a Short-Term Study Visa will be provided to you. This is used to apply for your Short-Term Study Visa.
- 8. Apply for your Short-Term Study Visa.
- 9. Once your visa has been granted, you can safely make your arrangements to come to Norwich and commence your studies. Congratulations!



# **Points-Based Student Visa**

### Bachelor's degree

- You should first contact the International Team for any course information, entry requirements, immigration information and a preliminary assessment. You will be asked to supply documentation such as a copy of your passport and prior qualifications at this stage.
- Formal application will be via the UCAS website at www.ucas.com. The required UCAS course code is listed for each degree in this prospectus.
- 3. The application will be assessed by both the International Team and the relevant academic staff. This may include an interview (which can be arranged via Teams or Zoom if you are outside of the UK.) A conditional approval may be given at this stage. This outcome will be informed to you both via your UCAS application and the International Team by email.
- 4. If you have been made an offer, accept this on UCAS.
- 5. The International Team will request any final required documentation (at this stage the documents for the financial requirements for a points-based student visa will be requested.)
- 6. The International Team will decide at this stage whether to sponsor you for a points-based student visa. If the college does agree, a formal written offer of admission will be sent to you by the International Team.
- 7. Accept the written offer, along with payment of the required fees.
- 8. A Confirmation of Acceptance of Study (CAS) for your student visa will be sent to you by the International Team, along with visa application instructions.
- 9. Apply for your points-based Student Visa.
- 10. Once your visa has been granted, you can safely make your arrangements to come to Norwich and commence your studies. Congratulations!
